Hold Beyond Recovery Platform Chapter Meetings Now

 At the citywide meetings, Chapter Chairs voted overwhelmingly by 97% to endorse the Beyond Recovery Platform. This platform, developed by UTLA members over months of meetings and discussions, will form the basis for our bargaining demands in the upcoming full contract negotiations.

Talking points for chapter meetings

The UTLA Beyond Recovery Platform

- Smaller class sizes and caseloads
- Improved salaries and working conditions
- Support for students' mental health and social needs

Our current struggle highlights the need to fight forward

These last few years have been the most difficult many of us have faced as educators. Even though UTLA members fought for some of the strongest safety measures in the country, there are challenges. The work goes on — collectively we continue our work to make schools as safe as possible and address critical return-to-school issues.

However, we lose when we only play defense. We must do two things at once: work for safety in our schools and go on the offense with an ambitious set of demands for our contract negotiations that begin in a few months.

Our schools and communities — historically underfunded, targeted for privatization, and disproportionately impacted by the pandemic — need a comprehensive plan for pandemic recovery <u>and beyond.</u>

The LAUSD budget for 2021-22 is expected to increase by \$5.4 billion, with a projected unrestricted reserve of \$2 billion by the end of the school year. We have a historic opportunity to force LAUSD to allocate the significant increase in funding to win our priorities now .

You will be voting in February on the <u>Beyond Recovery Platform</u>— the first time UTLA members will vote on a democratically developed platform of demands before contract negotiations with LAUSD begins. Developed by UTLA members and community allies over months of meetings and dialogue, it addresses the urgent needs of our schools at a time when historic levels of funding are coming to school districts.

This pandemic merely pulled back the curtain on how issues in our students' communities impact our classrooms and workspaces while educators remain overloaded and undervalued — a crisis deepening the severe staffing shortage, just when we need more caring adults on campus to meet our students' academic and mental health needs.

Voting to endorse this platform is the first message that 35,000 educators will send in the campaign of collective action that it will take to transform our schools. Our profession, our students, our schools, and our communities are worth fighting for.
