Hold Beyond Recovery Platform Chapter Meetings Now

 If you have not met with members at your site to discuss the Beyond Recovery Platform, it is important that you hold this meeting as soon as possible. The allmember vote on the platform is approaching soon and all members need to be familiar with the details of the platform before the vote. The platform was developed by UTLA members over months of meetings and discussions and will form the basis for our bargaining demands in the upcoming full contract negotiations. Chapter Chairs voted overwhelmingly by 97% to endorse the platform at the Jan. 6 Citywide meeting.

Safety updates

 COVID positivity rates in LAUSD are going down and student attendance is going up, but being an educator in this moment continues to be challenging and exhausting.

Federal, state, and county guidelines are constantly changing. We sent an updated FAQ to members last week, and we will continue providing information as we get it. FAQs about safety protocols and more can be found <u>here</u>.

District must suspend unnecessary student assessments

• The pandemic continues to highlight the need for educational programs to prioritize the emotional and physical well-being of our students, staff, and communities. Instead, the district is taxing students with unnecessary and time-consuming assessments that are of little use in this unique year of education.

Aligned with educators' long-time organizing against over-testing, UTLA leaders are calling on LAUSD to immediately suspend all district-mandated assessments that are not required by the state or federal government. <u>Read the letter here</u> to the interim superintendent and chief academic officer.

Eliminating or drastically reducing the number of nonessential standardized tests is part of the <u>Beyond Recovery platform</u> that UTLA members are voting on in February in advance of contract negotiations with LAUSD in the spring.
