YES on Prop 3 for Permanent Funding

California Proposition 3

Proposition 3 would permanently continue the existing tax on California's 2% wealthiest residents — which generates billions of dollars every year directly for classroom and instructional needs, including educator salaries.

Why We Need It

If Prop 3 isn't passed this year, LAUSD could stand to lose close to \$600 million annually starting in 2031. State affiliates have endorsed YES on Prop 3 to fight potential losses to public education funding. Joining educators up and down California to support Prop 3 is the first step to protecting the funding we have and setting up to fight for more.

State Superintendent

The California Superintendent of Public Instruction oversees every school system in the state, including LAUSD and the Los Angeles County Office of Education (LACOE), and manages the distribution of state funding to local school districts.

LA City Attorney

The City Attorney is an elected position to serve as the city's lawyer with the power to take on big corporations and enforce the laws that protect working families — like protecting communities from industrial pollution, workers from wage theft, and tenants from bad landlords.

LA City Council District 9

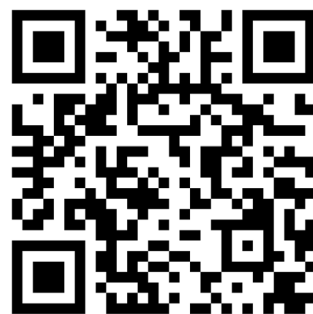
City Council District 9 represents South LA. Why Estuardo Mazariegos

He is a former union organizer who built a community coalition to win historic protections for tenants against bad landlords and lower rent increases in LA. Mazariegos has demonstrated a relentless commitment to making our city more affordable for working families and building strong public schools for LAUSD students.
